SECTION III

Crime Index Offenses Cleared

When at least one person is arrested, charged with the commission of an offense, and turned over to the court for prosecution, the reporting law enforcement agency clears or solves that particular offense (or possibly a number of offenses with which the perpetrator was involved) for UCR purposes. Just as the arrest of one individual may clear multiple crimes, the arrest of many persons may clear only one offense. Furthermore, clearances recorded for a specific calendar year such as 1999 may include offenses that occurred in previous years.

A law enforcement agency clears a crime by exceptional means when elements beyond its control prevent the placing of formal charges against the offender. In such instances, law enforcement must have identified the offender, possess enough evidence to support arrest, and identify the offender's location. Circumstances that permit exceptional clearances include the death of the offender (suicide, justifiably killed by police or private citizen, etc.); the victim's refusal to cooperate with prosecution after the offender has been identified; or the denial of extradition because the offender committed another crime in a different jurisdiction and is being prosecuted.

In 1999 a 21-percent Crime Index clearance rate (excluding arson) was recorded by law enforcement agencies nationwide. The clearance rate for the Modified Crime Index total, which includes arson (cleared at a rate of 17 percent), was also 21 percent.

Crimes against persons (murder, forcible rape, and aggravated assault) are often given more intensive investigative efforts than property crimes, and the victims and/or witnesses frequently identify the perpetrators. Therefore, clearance rates are generally higher for violent crimes than for property crimes. In 1999 the trend continued: 50 percent of violent crimes were cleared compared to the 18 percent of property crimes (excluding arson) that were cleared. Among the violent crime offenses, the murder clearance rate was 69 percent; aggravated assault, 59 percent; forcible rape, 49 percent; and robbery, 29 percent. For property crime offenses, 19 percent of larceny-thefts, 15 percent of motor vehicle thefts, and 14 percent of burglaries were cleared.

By region, law enforcement agencies in the Northeast recorded the highest total Crime Index clearance rate, 24 percent. The Southern States and the Western States registered clearance rates of 22 percent and 21 percent, respectively, and the Midwestern States showed a clearance rate of 20 percent. Violent crime clearance rates were 51 percent in the Northeast, 50 percent in both the South and the West, and 48 percent in the Midwest. For property crime, the Northeastern and Southern

regions registered clearance rates of 19 and 18 percent, respectively, and the Midwestern and Western regions recorded clearance rates of 17 percent each.

Rural county law enforcement agencies recorded a 23-percent clearance rate for Crime Index offenses, the highest among community types. Rural counties also registered violent and property crime clearance rates of 61 percent and 18 percent, respectively. Collectively, cities cleared 21 percent of Crime Index offenses, 48 percent of violent crimes, and 18 percent of property crimes. Among cities, those with populations of 10,000 to 24,999 registered the highest clearance rates for the Crime Index offenses at 25 percent and for property crime offenses at 22 percent. Cities with less than 10,000 inhabitants cleared the highest percentage of violent crimes at 60 percent. Suburban counties had clearance rates of 21 percent for reported serious offenses, 55 percent for violent crime, and 17 percent for property crime. (See Table 25.)

Clearances Involving Only Persons Under 18 Years of Age

For UCR purposes, a clearance by arrest is recorded when an offender under 18 years of age is cited to appear in juvenile court or before other juvenile authorities, even though no physical arrest may have occurred. The number of crimes in which juveniles are identified as the offenders may be evaluated to estimate the total amount of juvenile crime. The juvenile clearance percentages shown in this publication should be considered a slight underestimation of juvenile involvement in crime because these figures include only those offenses in which no adults were involved. According to 1999 Bureau of Census estimates, juveniles, or persons under 18 years of age, accounted for 26 percent of the United States population.

Nineteen percent of the Crime Index offenses cleared by law enforcement involved only juveniles in 1999. Juveniles accounted for 12 percent of the violent crime and 22 percent of the property crime clearances. Murder showed the lowest percentage of juvenile involvement, 6 percent, and arson, at 49 percent, indicated the highest percentage.

Regionally, the Midwestern States recorded the largest percentage of Crime Index offenses involving persons under the age of 18, clearing 24 percent. Juveniles alone were the offenders in 22 percent of the clearances in the Western States, 17 percent of the clearances in the Northeastern States, and 16 percent of the clearances in the Southern States.



Offenses Cleared by Arrest


