SECTION III

Crime Index Offenses Cleared

In the UCR Program, a reporting law enforcement agency clears or solves an offense when at least one person is arrested, charged with the commission of an offense, and turned over to the court for prosecution. The arrest of one person may clear many crimes. Conversely, the arrest of many persons may clear just one offense. In addition, clearances recorded in a particular calendar year such as 2000 may include offenses that occurred in previous years.

When elements beyond a law enforcement agency's control preclude the agency from placing formal charges against the offender, the offense is cleared by exceptional means. For an offense to be cleared by exceptional means, several criteria must be met. The agency must have:

1) identified the offender; 2) enough evidence to support an arrest; 3) identified the offender's location; and 4) a reason outside the agency's control that does not allow the agency to arrest, charge, and prosecute an offender. Examples of exceptional clearances include the death of the offender (suicide, justifiably killed by police or private citizens, etc.); the victim's refusal to cooperate with the prosecution after the identification of the offender; or the denial of extradition because the offender committed a crime in another jurisdiction and is being prosecuted.

Law enforcement agencies nationwide recorded a 20.5-percent Crime Index clearance rate, excluding arson, for 2000. The Modified Crime Index total, including the 16.0-percent clearance rate for arson, was 20.4 percent.

Murder, forcible rape, and aggravated assault—crimes against persons—often undergo a more concentrated investigative effort than crimes against property. In addition, victims and/or witnesses often identify the perpetrators. Hence, violent crimes tend to have higher clearance rates than property crimes. That likelihood continued in 2000 with 47.5 percent of violent crimes cleared compared to 16.7 percent of property crimes, excluding arson, cleared. When violent crime clearances are broken down, the murder clearance rate was 63.1 percent, the aggravated assault clearance rate was 56.9 percent, the forcible rape clearance rate was 46.9 percent, and the robbery clearance rate was 25.7 percent. Analysis of property crimes indicates that the larceny-theft clearance rate was 18.2 percent, the motor vehicle theft clearance rate was 14.1 percent, and the burglary clearance rate was 13.4 percent.

By region, law enforcement agencies in the Northeast recorded a 23.6 percent Crime Index clearance rate—the highest in the Nation. The Southern States had a 20.6 percent clearance rate, the Western States had a 19.6 percent clearance rate, and the Midwestern States had a 19.1 percent clearance rate. Violent crime clearance rates by region were 51.7 percent in the Northeast, 47.8 percent

in the South, 47.3 percent in the West, and 42.8 percent in the Midwest. For property crime, the Northeastern and Southern Regions posted clearance rates of 19.8 and 16.7 percent, respectively. The Midwestern and Western Regions recorded clearance rates of 16.4 and 15.5 percent, respectively.

Among community types, rural county law enforcement agencies recorded a 23.7-percent clearance rate for Crime Index offenses. Rural counties had a violent crime clearance rate of 61.3 percent and a property crime clearance rate of 18.7 percent. Collectively, cities cleared 20.2 percent of Crime Index offenses, 45.4 percent of violent crimes, and 16.8 percent of property crimes. Cities with populations of 10,000 to 24,999 listed the highest clearance rate for Crime Index offenses at 24.4 percent and property crimes at 21.5 percent. Among city groupings, the highest percentage of violent crimes cleared—60.6 percent—was registered in cities with less than 10,000 inhabitants. In suburban counties, 20.6 percent of serious offenses were cleared, as were 53.9 percent of violent crimes, and 16.0 percent of property crimes. (See Table 25.)

Clearances Involving Only Persons Under 18 Years of Age

When an offender under 18 years old is cited to appear in juvenile court or before other juvenile authorities, the UCR Program records that incident as a clearance by arrest, even though a physical arrest may not have occurred. The number of crimes in which juveniles are identified as the offenders may be evaluated to estimate the total amount of juvenile crime. Because the juvenile clearance percentages in this publication include only the offenses in which there were no adults involved, these figures should be considered a small underestimation of juvenile involvement in crime. Juveniles, defined as persons under 18 years of age, accounted for 25.5 percent of the Nation's population, according to the 2000 Bureau of the Census estimates.

Of the Crime Index offenses cleared by law enforcement, 19.3 percent involved only juveniles. In addition, crimes committed by juveniles accounted for 12.2 percent of violent crime and 22.1 of property crime clearances. Murder had the lowest percentage of juvenile involvement at 5.3 percent, and arson had the highest percentage of juvenile involvement at 45.9 percent.

By region, the Midwest had the largest percentage of Crime Index offenses involving juveniles, clearing 24.2 percent. In the Western States, juveniles alone accounted for 21.5 percent of the clearances; in the Northeastern States, 18.7 percent; and in the Southern States, 15.9 percent.
