Offense Analysis, Number and Percent Change, 2013–2014

- In 2014, the average dollar value per motor vehicle stolen in the U.S. was \$6,537. The average dollar value of property taken during burglaries was \$2,251; during robberies, \$1,227; and during larceny-thefts, \$941.
- By location, 73.2 percent of burglaries occurred at residences. Among robbery offenses, 41.0 percent occurred on streets or highways.
- In 2014, the number of offenses in four location categories of robbery decreased when compared with the 2013 totals. Among robbery locations, the number of robberies on streets or highways declined the most, 8.4 percent.
- Most larceny-thefts (46.3 percent) involved property valued at more than \$200.
