Five-Year Arrest Trends, by Sex, 2010–2014

- In 2014, the number of males arrested decreased 14.6 percent, and the number of females arrested decreased 8.5 percent when compared with figures from 2010.
- The number of juvenile males (those under age 18) arrested in 2014 dropped 37.4 percent, and the number of arrests of juvenile females fell 38.5 percent when compared with the 2010 data.
- An examination of 5-year trend data indicated that the number of males arrested for violent crimes decreased 10.7 percent, and the number of females arrested for these offenses declined 6.5 percent.
- The number of males arrested for murder in 2014 decreased 6.6 percent when compared with 2010 arrest data while the number of females arrested for murder in 2014 rose 2.2 percent.
- Arrests of juveniles for violent crimes decreased for both genders in 2014 when compared with data for 2010. The number of arrests of juvenile males dropped 29.8 percent; the number of arrests of juvenile females fell 29.9 percent.
