Ten-Year Arrest Trends, by Sex, 2009–2018

- In 2018, the number of males arrested declined 24.2 percent when compared with data for 2009; the number of females arrested fell 15.1 percent for the same comparison period.
- Arrests of juvenile (persons under age 18) males dropped 58.8 percent, and arrests of juvenile females decreased 57.7 percent when data for 2018 were compared with statistics for 2009.
- The number of males arrested for violent crimes in 2018 decreased 13.4 percent from the number arrested in 2009. The number of females arrested for violent crimes decreased 0.7 percent.
- Arrests of juveniles for violent crimes declined for both genders in 2018 when compared with data for 2009. The number of arrests of juvenile males decreased 41.7 percent, and the number of arrests of juvenile females dropped 34.6 percent.
- The number of males arrested for property crimes in 2018 declined 30.8 percent from the number arrested in 2009, and the number of females arrested for property crimes fell 31.8 percent.
- Arrests of juvenile males and juvenile females for property crimes decreased 65.3 percent and 72.8 percent, respectively, when data for 2018 were compared with data for 2009.
- The only increase in arrests of males was a 6.9 percent increase for motor vehicle theft. Arrests of females rose in nine categories. The greatest increases in arrests of females were for motor vehicle theft, 44.9 percent; drug abuse violations, 39.7 percent; weapons (carrying, possessing, etc.), 18.5 percent; and vagrancy, 14.6 percent. Among juveniles, the only increases in arrests were for males under 18

arrested for embezzlement, 1.7 percent; and females under 18 arrested for murder, 7.5 percent.
