



## Andrew James Castor, Deputy Associate Deputy Director



Andrew James Castor is the Deputy Associate Deputy Director and a 25-year veteran of the Federal Bureau of Investigation. He was promoted into this position by the Director in 2013 and oversees the management of all FBI personnel, budget, administration, and infrastructure. Prior to this assignment in the Director's Office, he also served as the Deputy Assistant Director of the FBI's Counterterrorism Division Operational Support Branch and as the Special Agent in Charge of all criminal matters at the Washington D.C. office.

A native of Ohio, Mr. Castor holds a bachelor's degree in accounting from Purdue University, and a master's degree in business administration from the University of the Incarnate Word.

In 1989, Mr. Castor joined the FBI as a special agent. He was first assigned to the Bureau's San Antonio office, investigating a wide range of white collar criminal matters including large scale bank failures. He earned several awards during his time in San Antonio, including the Western District of Texas Law Enforcement Officer of the Year. In 1996, Mr. Castor was promoted to a supervisory position in the Financial Crimes Section of the Criminal Investigative Division at FBI Headquarters in Washington D.C. In that role, he led the national program investigating financial institution fraud; specifically in the areas of mortgage and loan fraud, check fraud, and electronic payment systems fraud.

In 1999, Mr. Castor was promoted to a supervisory field role in Bureau's Cleveland office. There, he managed agents and analysts investigating securities fraud, public corruption, telemarketing, financial institution fraud and antitrust. In this role he coordinated all white collar crimes for the Cleveland office. In 2003, Mr. Castor was promoted to the number two position in the Bureau's San Antonio office, overseeing criminal investigations as well as national security matters revolving around counterterrorism and counterintelligence matters.

In 2005, Mr. Castor joined the senior executive ranks of the FBI within the Finance Division, taking on the responsibilities of chief of the Accounting Section. During his tenure managed the \$8 billion in FBI appropriated funds. In 2006, Mr. Castor was named deputy assistant director for Human Resources taking responsibility for human capital initiatives for 32,000 employees.
